

My Name is Thomas J. French # BK8811.

I am currently a inmate in San Quentin State prison in the Reception area.. I am a Transient to California. Originally I am from the north eastern united states (NY) New York (VT) Vermont & (NH) New Hampshire. I have been in California for a year now, Ten months of that, I have been bouncing in B Adams C, A in a Sheriff transport van.. Now I am back in "SQ." which brings me to this letter..

Thank you for showing me & people like me we are not just sitting waiting for the inevitable to happen to us like long forgotten pets..

We get cold food 3 times a day staff go's home & come's back unmasked with minimum checks done to insure our safety on our proposed release date's, I got 9 months left to, I bit get out on my E.P.R.D. I pray & hope to see that happen I and many like me are in a sea of not knowing.. We sit here in our cells 24 hours a

day. We get 1. 15 minute phone call a week
if we choose not to go to yard..

99.9% of us are asking what's going on
Many of us if granted our 315 time would be
possibly eligible for release. I know that
back east this epidemic has hit hard and I
don't know how to respond to the fact that, I
have nowhere in 'ca' to go & can't begin to even
think about what might happen while I
am here.. But just the simple fact that knowing
some one is fighting for us gives me lots of
other's a glent of hope." Thank you for that in
response, I am grateful...

Sitting in the dark is scary all the what
if's are frustrating & sometimes the only thing
a person can do is hope.
