

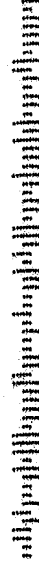

However I am not only writing this letter to give thanks, but to also reach out for some hope, and possibly some help. My name is Gilbert Jess Gallardo and I am currently a inmate at San Quentin state prison. I am fortunately exposed here at this ~~amazing~~ amazing historic facility. But I can not leave to the main line because of this terrible virus that has hit our country. I have brought up my situation because to my understanding its only a bed move, not a transfer. I have not got no response back from anyone. Its sucks to say that I dont even feel like I am being treated as a human being. I dont know if its because I am in protective custody, and with the worst of the worst. But who is to judge but GOD. However, I have to say that theres no what so ever clarity here in South block Alpine Section. No Announcements, No communication. And I am really hoping and also praying that who ever reads this letter can at least try and understand the hurt, and pain on not being able to get to their families some far way →

later. And I say this because in your pamphlet you mention the over crowding and thinning out the prison population. Especially for the already ill, and for the elderly. However, I myself and other inmates are qualified for milestones, ankle monitor, 33 percent and other opportunities that would get us to our families faster. But we cant because we are stagnant. And I am speaking for the ones that are endorced here at San Quentine state prison. The other day a correctional officer said they just transferred 90 inmates from here to corcoran state prison. And I cant even get a bed now? Eneyhow I am a husband, a father, and a caretaker of a wonderful dog named KHAN." And I would love to go home and never look back at this horrible place. God has blessed me with a wonderful, and amazing family that I truly love dearly. I just want to go home. To the prison university project know you are so very awesome and know you will be always in my prayers.
